The Council met in the Chambers of the City Building at 7:00 P.M., for the first meeting in the month of June on the 2nd day, in the year 2014, and was called to order by the Honorable Mayor, Danny Jones. REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

COMMITTEE ON PLANNING

Councilperson Mary Jean Davis, Chairperson of the Council Committee on Planning, submitted the following reports:

1. Your committee on Planning has had under consideration Bill Number 7619, and reports the same to Council with the recommendation that the bill do pass.

Bill No. 7619- A Bill amending the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Charleston, West Virginia, enacted the 1st day of January 2006, as amended, and the map made a part thereof, by rezoning from an R-O district to a C-8 district, that certain parcel of land situate at the 909 Oakhurst Drive, Charleston, West Virginia.

Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Charleston, West Virginia:

- 1. The Zoning Ordinance of the City of Charleston, West Virginia, enacted the 1st day of January 2006, as amended, is hereby amended by rezoning from an R-O district to a C-8 district the whole of the following described parcel of land: Parcel No. 17 as shown on South Annex Tax Map No. 11. Subject parcel commonly known as 909 Oakhurst Drive, Charleston, West Virginia. Said tax map is of record in the Planning Office.
- 2. The Zoning Map, attached to and made a part of said Zoning Ordinance, is hereby amended in accordance with Article 27 of this ordinance.
- 3. All prior ordinances or parts of ordinances, inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Councillady Davis moved to approve the Bill. Councilman Ware seconded the motion. The question being on the passage of the Bill. A roll call was taken and there were; yeas – 23, nays – 0, abstain, - 1 as follows:

With a vote recorded thereon as voting in the affirmative the Mayor declared Bill 7619 adopted.

2. Your committee on Planning has had under consideration Bill Number 7620 (Committee Substitute), and reports the same to Council with the recommendation that the bill do pass.

Bill No. 7620 - A Bill closing, abandoning and discontinuing as a public right-of-way a street known as 1st Avenue situated between 2nd Avenue and Kanawha Boulevard, in the City of Charleston, West Virginia, and reserving a sewer easement for the City of Charleston.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF CHARLESTON, WEST VIRGINIA

1. The public right-of-way commonly known as 40 foot street known as 1st Avenue, located in the 4th Ward of the City of Charleston, Kanawha County, West Virginia, more aptly described as follows:

Beginning at a point at northwest corner of the intersection of Stockton Street and 1st Avenue marked by a nail found and proceeding southwest along right-of-way line of Stockton Street S 35°0'0" W for distance of 40 feet then proceeding northeast along line S 53°48'0" E for a distance of 100 feet then proceeding northeast N 35°0'0" E for a distance of 40 feet to an "X" marked in the concrete then returning southeast S 53°48'0" E for 100 feet with said area being approximately 4000 square feet more or less.

2. The City of Charleston hereby reserves a 15 feet sewer easement for the full length of the above described right-of-way for the purpose of construction, maintenance, repair and removal of storm and sanitary sewer line. No person shall construct improvements or take any other actions which would interfere with this easement, or alter the present surface profile or contour of the subject right of way by more than one (1) foot without written permission of the City Engineer and Charleston Sanitary Board.

- 32. The Mayor of the City of Charleston be, and is hereby authorized and directed to execute, acknowledge and deliver a proper deed conveying to HospiceCare, Inc. and its successors in office, all rights, title and interest in and to said property as described in Section 1 above, except as provided in Section 2 above, for the consideration of <u>Seven Thousand dollars and no cents (\$7000.00)</u>.
- 4. All prior ordinances, or parts of ordinances, inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Councillady Davis moved to adopt the Bill, but to be referred to Finance. Councilman Ware seconded the motion. Received and Filed.

Beginning at a point at northwest corner of the intersection of Stockton Street and 1st Avenue marked by a nail found and proceeding southwest along right-of-way line of Stockton Street S 35°0'0" W for distance of 40 feet then proceeding northeast along line S 53°48'0" E for a distance of 100 feet then proceeding northeast N 35°0'0" E for a distance of 40 feet to an "X" marked in the concrete then returning southeast S 53°48'0" E for 100 feet with said area being approximately 4000 square feet more or less.

- 2. The City of Charleston hereby reserves a 15 feet sewer easement for the full length of the above-described right-of-way for the purpose of construction, maintenance, repair and removal of storm and sanitary sewer line. No person shall construct improvements or take any other actions which would interfere with this easement, or alter the present surface profile or contour of the subject right of way by more than one (1) foot without written permission of the City Engineer and Charleston Sanitary Board.
- 32. The Mayor of the City of Charleston be, and is hereby authorized and directed to execute, acknowledge and deliver a proper deed conveying to HospiceCare, Inc. and its successors in office, all rights, title and interest in and to said property as described in Section 1 above, except as provided in Section 2 above, for the consideration of Seven Thousand dollars and no cents (\$7000.00).
- 4. All prior ordinances, or parts of ordinances, inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

WHEREAS, the 2010 Census taken under the authority of the U.S. Census Bureau, which showed a decline in residential population in Charleston, indicates that the existing wards of the City of Charleston, which were established in 2002, are disproportionate in population; and WHEREAS, West Virginia Code 8-5-7 authorizes the governing body of a municipality to, by ordinance, increase or decrease the number of wards; change boundaries of wards, and increase or decrease the number of councilmen to correspond with the number of wards, so that each ward may have equal representation on the governing body; and WHEREAS, the City of Charleston retained a consultant with expertise in this area to review the population disparity among the various wards and to propose a solution to the same, with said solution to provide for as equal representation as reasonably practicable; WHEREAS, said consultant reviewed the population disparity and presented her findings

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and conclusions to the Committee on Redistricting, with the recommendation that the one of twenty-one wards be eliminated and that the remaining twenty wards be redrawn consistent with the geographic description (metes and bounds) of the attached plan (the "Consultant's Plan"); and

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WHEREAS, the Committee on Redistricting considered the Consultant's Plan at public meetings held on November 6, 2013, November 13, 2013, and April 23, 2014, and based on the consultant's conclusions and recommendations, concluded that the Consultant's Plan considered population as the primary factor in the reapportionment of the wards, that said Plan has a population deviation that is within acceptable tolerances, that said Plan

provides as equal representation as reasonably practicable, and that said Plan should be introduced to the full Council.

Now Therefore, Be it Ordained by the Council of the City of Charleston, West Virginia:

1. For purposes of the 2015 municipal elections (primary and general), and for municipal elections thereafter, the residents of the City of Charleston shall elect 20 ward representative council members consistent with the Consultant's Plan which divides the City into twenty wards. The geographic description of each ward is described in the attached Consultant's Plan and shall be on file in the City Clerk's office.

2. Commencing with the swearing in of the Council of the City of Charleston duly elected in 2015, the City of Charleston shall be divided into twenty wards consistent with the Consultant's Plan and the City Council of Charleston shall consist of twenty-six council members, with one member to be elected from each of the twenty wards specified in Section 1 of this ordinance, and six members to be elected at-large.

3. For clarification, all currently sitting Councilmembers will retain their position until those individuals elected at the next municipal election are sworn in and take office.

4. All prior ordinances or parts of ordinances, inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of said inconsistency.
