WHEREAS: An excess levy election has been set for Tuesday, May 8, 2018, to provide the voters of Kanawha County the opportunity to approve an excess tax levy for the years beginning July 1, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023, to support the operations of the Kanawha County Emergency Ambulance Authority (KCEEA), which has established and maintains an emergency ambulance system for Kanawha County; the Kanawha Valley Regional Transportation Authority (KVRTA), the owner and operator of the public bus transportation system serving Kanawha County and its citizens; and the establishment of an Emergency Services Fund, to assist and support public law enforcement and public fire protection agencies within Kanawha County; and

WHEREAS: The proposed excess levy is needed for the continued operation of the Ambulance and Transportation Authority, and to assist local police and fire departments to meet the public safety concerns of the citizens and will be used to provide funds for the acquisition of equipment, capital improvements and to cover in part current general maintenance and operational expenses as well as match funds from the government of the United States and others; and

WHEREAS: The proposed levy rate was not increased to ensure that the Kanawha County taxpayers would not face any increase in the taxes allocated for these services.

Therefore be it resolved by The Council and Mayor

of The City of Charleston, West Virginia:

That the City of Charleston does hereby endorse the proposed special levy to be voted on May 8, 2018, and urges all voters in Kanawha County to vote for the levy which will result in the continued operation and expansion of the emergency ambulance system and provide for the continued operation and improvement of the mass transportation system and provide supplemental funding for public law enforcement and public fire protection agencies within Kanawha County, all of which are essential to the general welfare of all the people of the City of Charleston..

Councilmember Lane moved to approve the Resolution. Councilmember Ware seconded the motion. With a majority of members elected recorded thereon as voting in the affirmative the Mayor declared adopted.

COMMITTEE ON PLANNING

Councilmember Davis, Chair of the Council Committee on Planning, submitted the following reports:

1. Your committee on Planning has had under consideration the following bill, and reports the same to Council with the recommendation that Bill No. 7774 do pass.

<u>Bill No. 7774</u> - Amending the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Charleston, West Virginia, adopted January 1, 2006, as amended, by clarifying the regulations regarding open storage in both residential and commercial zoning districts.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHARLESTON, WEST VIRGINIA

1. The Zoning Ordinance for the City of Charleston, West Virginia, effective January 1, 2006, is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 3-080 Accessory Structures and Uses in Residential Districts

- C. Open Storage in Residential Districts
- 1. The storage, collecting, dismantling, salvaging or repairing of more than one (1) piece of machinery, inoperative, expired inspection sticker, or unlicensed, motor vehicles, motor vehicles with expired inspection stickers, machinery, or appliances is prohibited when not within an area screened from view by walls and a roof. However, one (1) inoperative, expired inspection sticker, or unlicensed motor vehicle, or one (1) motor vehicle with an expired inspection sticker may be temporarily stored in an area not screened from view by walls and a roof for a period not to exceed 7 consecutive days.

Sec. 3-090 Accessory Structures and Uses in Commercial Districts

- A. Customary and incidental accessory buildings and uses are allowed in all commercial districts, as specifically regulated in that district, provided:
- 1. The storage, collecting, dismantling, salvaging or repairing of more than one (1) piece of machinery, inoperative <u>or unlicensed motor vehicles, motor vehicles with expired inspection stickers</u>, or unlicensed, motor vehicle, <u>machinery</u>, or appliances is prohibited <u>when not within an area screened from view by walls and a roof</u>, unless customary and incidental to the primary business <u>conducted on the site</u>. Such as an auto repair unless totally screened from view.
 - 2. All prior ordinances or parts of ordinances, inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

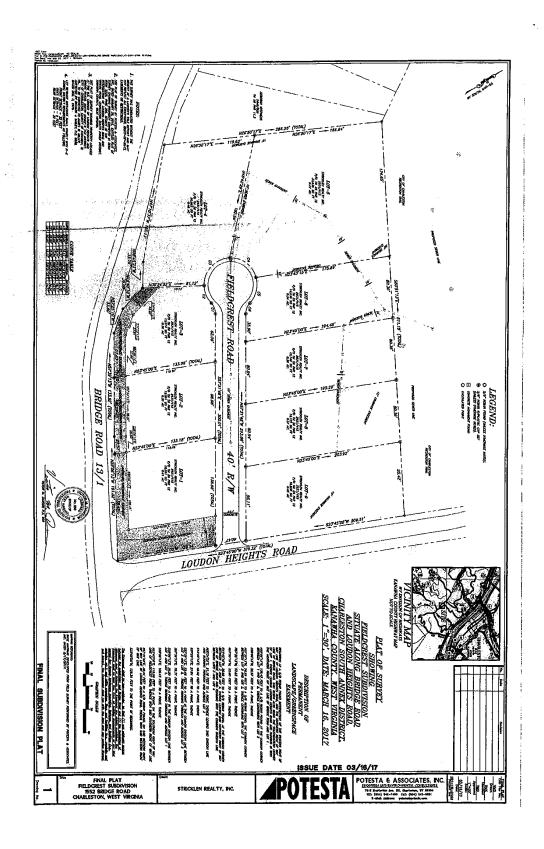

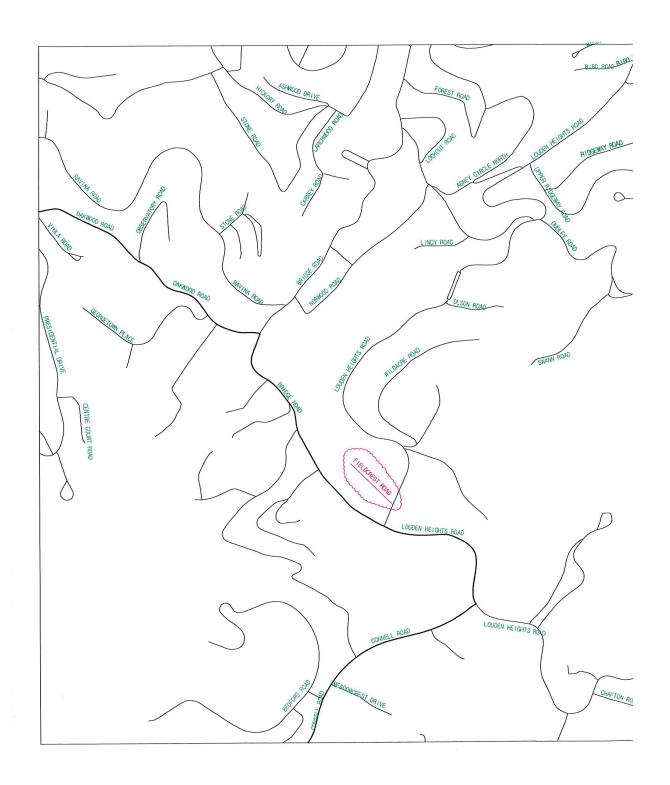
- 1. The Developer submitted a two year \$36,000.00 maintenance bond to cover any future damage to the road; and

COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

Councilmember Reishman, Chair of the Council Committee on Finance, submitted the following reports:

1. Your committee on Finance has had under consideration the following resolution, and reports the same to Council with the recommendation that Resolution No. 015-18 be adopted.

Resolution No. 015-18 - Authorizing the City Manager to execute an agreement with Frontier Communications for modifications to the Multiprotocol Label Switching (MPLS) Network and Internet Connections by changing nine (9) sites from 1.5 mbps to 10 mbps at an additional cost of \$ 410/month/site, changing one (1) site from 10 mbps to 100 mbps at an additional cost of \$ 964/month, and changing one (1) site from 200 mbps to 400 mbps at an additional cost of \$ 2224.00/month, for a total monthly increase of \$ 5238.00.

Be it Resolved by the Council of the City of Charleston, West Virginia:

That the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to execute an agreement with Frontier Communications for modifications to the Multiprotocol Label Switching (MPLS) Network and Internet Connections by changing nine (9) sites from 1.5 mbps to 10 mbps at an additional cost of \$ 410/month/site, changing one (1) site from 10 mbps to 100 mbps at an additional cost of \$ 964/month, and changing one (1) site from 200 mbps to 400 mbps at an additional cost of \$ 2224.00/month, for a total monthly increase of \$ 5238.00.

(RMSC) for Third Party Administration of Workers Compensation and Property/Casualty Claims in accordance with the costs attached and a fee advance of \$103,720.00; and further authorizing the Mayor or City Manager to sign the appropriate forms rejecting the underinsured motorists coverage and accepting the uninsured motorists coverage.

WHEREAS, [5] houses are located on Anderson Heights Road; and

WHEREAS, in order to provide safe ingress and egress to and from the homes located on Anderson Heights Road the road needs to be widened to allow for two vehicle lanes, and an area allowing vehicles to turn around at the end of the road needs to be constructed; and

WHEREAS, the City had the properties appraised by an independent appraiser who returned an appraised value of \$1.24/sq. ft. and have negotiated the sale of property necessary for widening the road and constructing the turnaround;

Now, therefore, be it Ordained by the Council of the City of Charleston, West Virginia:

That the purchase of the property located along Anderson Heights Road, as more fully described in Exhibit A hereto, from owners set forth in Exhibit A is hereby authorized for a total consideration of the sum of \$6,341.29, all for the purpose of widening Anderson Heights Road and creating a turnaround for local vehicular traffic.

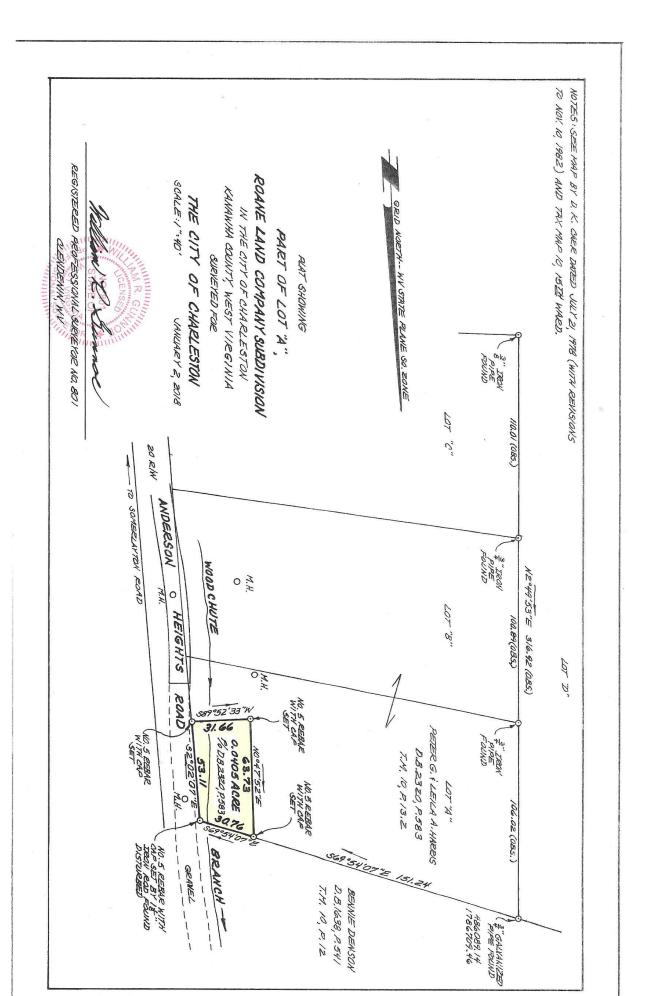

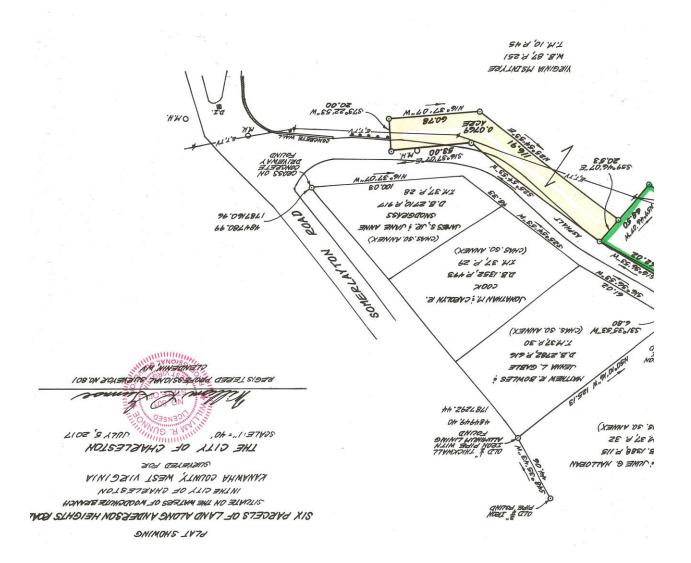
