COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

Councilmember Jenkins, Chair of the Council Committee on Finance, submitted the following reports:

1. Your committee on Finance has had under consideration the following resolution, and reports the same to Council with the recommendation that Resolution No. 167-19 do pass.

Resolution No. 167-19 - Authorizing the Mayor or her designee to Receive and administer \$15,000 from the WV State Police Commission on Drunk Driving Prevention to fund overtime DUI patrols and checkpoints.

Be it Resolved by the Council of the City of Charleston, West Virginia:

That the Mayor or her designee is hereby authorized and directed to Receive and administer \$15,000 from the WV State Police Commission on Drunk Driving Prevention to fund overtime DUI patrols and checkpoints.

Councilmember Jenkins added that the resolution is authorizing to receive and administrate a \$15,000 grant that was previously approved on January 22, 2019 through Resolution No. 158-19. This is the first amount the City has been awarded for the year.

Councilmember Jenkins moved to approve the Resolution. Councilmember Ceperley seconded the motion. With a majority of members elected recorded thereon as voting in the affirmative the Mayor declared Resolution 167-19 adopted.

NEW BILLS

1. Introduced by Councilmember Keeley Steele on February 19, 2019:
Bill No. 7803 –A Bill to amend Ordinance No. 7785, which established a two-hour limit parking zone along the east side of Michigan Avenue from a point 30 feet from the intersection of Kanawha Boulevard, E. to the intersection of Quarrier Street such that the aforementioned two-hour limit parking zone is limited to apply only to the hours of 8:00 am until 5:00 pm Monday through Friday and amending the Traffic Control Map and Traffic Control File.
