OVER 45 TONS OF REFUSE COLLECTED DURING CLEAN UP EVENT

40 tons of storm debris collected in Kanawha City and South Hills this past Saturday

(Charleston, W.Va.) - Mayor Amy Shuler Goodwin announced today that over 45 tons of refuse (40 tons of storm debris) was collected at the Spring 2024 Team Up to Clean Up event on Saturday, April 6, 2024. Approximately 60 volunteers representing local businesses, organizations and the city came together to clean and beautify the Kanawha City and South Hills areas.

“Volunteers and especially the City’s Public ground crews really showed up for the residence of Kanawha City and South Hills this weekend,” said Mayor Amy Shuler Goodwin. “We had multiple backhoe crews clearing large tree and storm debris, along with groups of volunteers walking the streets collecting litter—it truly was an all-hands-on deck effort from our community.”
